



## Dear Families,

As a nation we commemorated ANZAC day last weekend. At OLMC the students marked ANZAC day with a prayer reflection led by our students in Year 1 on Monday afternoon. ## **MOTHERS' DAY LITURGY**

In honour of our brilliant OLMC mothers, we will be hosting a Mothers' Day Liturgy on the Friday 7th of May. This will take place at 2:20pm on the back playground. While this event looks a little different to what we would normally host, we are hoping that the mothers and grandmothers of OLMC will be able to join us. Due to current restrictions, the number of attendees is limited to 2 adults per family. To allow for the maximum number of attendees there will be allocated seating, therefore, families **MUST RSVP before the 30th of April.** Any RSVPs after this date will not be accepted.

## **VOLUNTEER CHILD PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS**

As part of the <u>NEW</u> Building Child Safe Communities requirements, volunteers are required to attend a school-based briefing session. These sessions cover topics such as child protection, privacy, school procedures, volunteer's responsibilities and guidance with the online components. Volunteers MUST attend a briefing session every 2 years to satisfy all child protection requirements to continue to volunteer at OLMC.

The first sessions this Term will be Thursday and Friday at 10am. Volunteers only have to attend one session every two years with a record of your attendance being held by the school.

## **BAND UPDATE (BEGINNING WK3)**

The Training Band will begin their afternoon lessons on Wednesday 5 May. Afternoon Band lessons are from 3-4pm. Parents are asked to promptly collect the children at 4pm. Parents collecting younger siblings will be able to wait on the front playground until the lessons are over.
