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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

The joy has continued this week as we have been able to welcome back all of our Year 2, Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 children. Finally our OLMC family is back together. The children have settled back into school life and are coping with the adjustments to their learning space and our timetable.

Just as parents have had to re-adjust to going back to work life and acclimatising to the office/shop/site, so are our children. They are rebuilding their stamina to remain focused on their work and sharing with classmates. The children are re-learning social skills that they haven't had to use in their home learning environment. The one thing that has been very evident is their enthusiasm to be back at school with their friends and teachers.

Our Sunday readings this week continue the themes of return and healing. The Gospel tells the story of Jesus healing the bilind man as he left Jericho. For us in our modern lives this healing of the blind is not the literal healing but the metaphorical healing. It is through our faith in Jesus and his example of living that our 'blindness' to the needs of others and the world around us can be healed. We are encouraged to come out of ourselves to see the wider world around us. Sometimes this openness to vision allows us to see that our personal challenges, while significant to us individually, may not be as bad as we feel in the perspective of the world around us. This realisation can then help us to cope better.

O Jesus Christ, teacher and healer, you heard the cry of the blind beggar when others would have silenced him. Teach us to be attentive to the voices others ignore, that we might respond through the power of the Spirit to heal the afflicted and to welcome the abandoned for your sake and the sake of the gospel. Amen

I would like to thank our parents for adjusting to the new pickup arrangements so well. Your patience along with your safe and respectful behaviour makes it easier for us to keep our children safe. Keep following the road rules and drive on if there is no parking to allow for the flow of traffic. After 3:20pm any children still waiting to be collected will be brought to the front playground. Finally I would like to say thank you to all in our community for the amazing efforts you have put in during Remote Learning. ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATION

With all of our students now expected to have returned, notifying the school of your child's attendance reverts to our previous procedures.

When your child is away you are required to notify the school about their absence using the COMPASS PARENT PORTAL.

If we don't receive notice within 7 days we are required to record the absence as unexplained. We encourage all parents to log back into their portal, to ensure all is working. If you need to reset your password, parents can click on "Can't access your account?" link on the school portal and follow the prompts.

Resetting of user passwords is a restricted process and cannot be performed by school staff.

UNIFORMS AND HAIRCUTS

Thank you to all our parents in ensuring that the children have returned to school in their correct summer uniform. We remind parents and children that popular hair trends may not be appropriate for school. Boys' cuts should be blended without patterns or lines and not shorter than a number one. All hair longer than the shoulders is expected to be tied back for hygiene purposes.

SECOND HAND UNIFORMS

The Second Hand Uniform relies on the donation of items from our school community. We have had a large number of parents seeking items with our return to school, but we have limited stock. If your child has grown out of their uniform items please consider donating them to the 2nd Hand Uniform shop. Just send them to the office, washed and in a bag marked 2nd Hand Uniform donations

STUDENT ILLNESS

It is normal that from time to time children will fall ill. With the current situation, we are asking parents to be extremely vigilant, as our staff will be, to ensure <u>that you do not</u> send your child to school, even if they have the slightest of symptoms.

- Students who are absent from school or who have been sent home due to flu like symptoms <u>must be tested</u>
- If a student is sent home from school, their siblings will also be sent home with them
- Students must not return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom-free
- Schools must **sight the negative COVID-19 test result** prior to allowing students to return to school i.e. NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre correspondence (SMS or email or hard copy) and/or a medical certificate must be provided to the school and a record of this kept by the school.
- If your child is being tested and awaiting results, Parents are expected to inform the school so that we can apply a 'Flexible' code for attendance.

• This is a measure that is also expected of our staff and their families also. We know this is challenging for families, however, this is one of our vital safety measures which significantly reduces the risk of spread and possible school closure.

SCHOOL UNIFORMS - LAST DAY

The last day to place your orders for school uniforms for 2021 will be by 4pm on **Tuesday, 7 December**. Please ensure you place your orders via the QKR App to receive delivery on Thursday, 9 December.

If families miss the cutoff they will need to email Elle from OzFashions by email <u>elle@ozfashions.com.au</u> for either a home delivery or pick up from Oz Fashions in Granville, no later than 15 December. After this date, the warehouse will close over the Christmas period.
