KINDERGARTEN 2023

The 2023 Kindergarten enrolment period has already commenced. Enrolment packs will be available for prospective parents to collect from the office and are **due back before the 1st of April**. Our final Open Afternoon and School Tour is on Thursday March 3rd at 4pm. We encourage all prospective families to attend a tour as they provide an opportunity for you to get a 'feel' for the school, meet other parents and staff and ask any questions you may have about the enrolment process. EXTENDED LEAVE

Due to restrictions, we are not able to have <u>ANY</u> children onsite whilst parents are onsite, this includes the children who attend OLMC. If you have an appointment between 8am-8:30am and 3:15pm-3:50pm your child/children may accompany you to your meeting or wait on the pick up line. Any other times <u>MUST BE CHILD FREE</u>. We know this is an inconvenience, however, we must follow the strict guidelines provided to us to ensure the safety of our community.

WINTER UNIFORMS

Families are encouraged to organise winter uniforms for their child/ren as early as possible. We are unable to provide try-on sizes at school but a size guide is at the end of this newsletter. All orders for uniforms should be placed using the Qkr app by 4pm on Tuesdays so that delivery can be made each Thursday. The last day for ordering this term will be Tuesday 5 April. Students must wear their winter uniform from the beginning of Term 2. Please update your child's 2022 class on the app.

PROJECT COMPASSION 2022

This year, we are receiving *cashless donations* using our school *Qkr! app.* The donation window will be open from **Mon 7th March (Wk 7) until Fri 8th April (Wk 11).** For \$5 your child's grade will earn a duck, while \$10 will earn the grade a pig.

COVID RESTRICTION UPDATE

- Positive tests or students identified as close contacts MUST be reported to the school via a phone call to the School
 Office or an email to the School email address.
- Reporting positive COVID diagnoses with Service NSW remains the same
- From **Monday 7 March**, masks will no longer be mandatory for all students and staff in primary schools. Staff, students and parents are able to continue wearing masks if they choose to do so.
- All staff and visitors will still be required to sign-in and sign-out.
- Stringent hygiene and cleaning practices within the classroom and in shared spaces are to be maintained.
- Pick up and Drop off arrangements remain the same with the slight adjustment to the front gate afternoon pick up. As the number of parents attending the front gate is larger than any other area, and access is more restricted, we will go back to students sitting in their lines and parents walking in and spreading out. Children will have to raise their hand to be dismissed. Once parents have their children, they are asked to leave promptly to allow for traffic flow and minimal congregating.
- Assembly remains via zoom
- Parents are still not able to attend events. We have decided to take a cautious approach and will continue to monitor the situation. We will advise families on when this restriction is lifted.

Premier's Reading Challenge 2022

Students will receive their PRC online login details on Friday for you to begin updating your child's reading record. For our parents with children in K, 1 or 2, your child's reading log is updated by Mrs Anderiesz from the books they experience with their class over the course of the challenge period.

- Students from Kinder-Year 2 must read a total of 30 books (25 from the <u>Premier's Reading Challenge list</u> and 5 of their personal choice)
- Students from Year 3-Year 6 must read a total of 20 books (15 from the <u>Premier's Reading Challenge list</u> and 5 of their personal choice)
- Challenge closes for student on Friday 19 August 2022 so LET'S GET READING


