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# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

Last Friday as a school we marked the National Day of Action Against Bullying with workshops and activities focusing on the power of kindness and we were encouraged to build a Culture of Kindness. Now, it is no secret that I love to read and this year's theme reminded me of a book that I read some time ago called 'Wonder' by RJ Palacio. Some of you may know the story through the popular movie.

One of the teaser headings for the book was, 'You can't blend in when you were born to stand out.' This novel told the story of a boy named August who was born with a terrible facial abnormality. He was homeschooled and at the age of ten the decision was made for him to start attending school. The book tells of August's experiences adjusting to his first year at school and how his classmates helped him find his feet.

One of the overarching themes of this novel was the idea of Kindness. An act of kindness can mean the world to someone. It is a way of reaching out to another person and making a difference in their life or providing hope for the hopeless. It doesn't take a great deal of effort to be kind, but its impact can be far reaching. There are many ways we can show kindness to the people in our lives or complete strangers:

- saying hello with a smile
- offering to complete a small job
- taking a few minutes to have a chat
- offering a word of encouragement when it is needed
- extending an act of friendship
- giving way to another driver

The author of Peter Pan, JM Barrie in his book The Little White Bird wrote the following about kindness:

"Shall we make a new rule of life...always try to be kinder than is necessary?"

As humans we carry not just the capacity to be kind, but the very choice of kindness. It is in the choices we make about offering our acts of kindness that we provide the face of God in human form.

As a Catholic community we have begun the season of Lent. This season is traditionally a time of preparation and reflection. It is a perfect opportunity to reflect on how we are able to express the face of God through our acts of kindness. We rarely realise the impact an act of kindness, which we demonstrate, has on another person, yet we know how it feels to receive kindness. As we continue through the season of Lent and beyond, how will you try to be kinder than is necessary? How can you contribute to building a Culture of Kindness?

#### SAFE PARKING - NO PARKING IN DRIVEWAYS

As parents of our school community we expect you to be safe and respectful when you are dropping of and picking up your child/ren from school. Recently there have been reports of unsafe, intimidating and disrespectful behaviour from some of our parents and carers. One of the main issues recently is parents and carers who use the driveway outside the Bennett Street gate as a parking spot. Some parents pull into this space, between parked cars, blocking traffic flow while their child 'quickly jumps out' of the car. This is



unsafe and unacceptable behaviour from our parents and carers. **The driveway is not a parking spot or drop off point.** If you cannot safely park you need to drive around the block and try again. The example of your behaviour is observed by your child. We all need to be aware of the impact of our words and actions.

## **WINTER UNIFORMS**

Sibling families who are wanting to enrol a child in 2023 MUST return their completed forms asap to ensure you are able to attend an interview BEFORE the end of Term 1. Returning forms late could jeopardise your child's place

as enrolment offers to new families will begin Day 1 of Term 2.

#### **EMAILING STAFF**

We value our strong relationship with families and welcome opportunities to communicate with parents and carers. We also recognise that email is a fast and convenient way to contact your child's teacher or other school staff.

Although staff will read their emails at various times throughout the school day, their priority is teaching the children and preparing for their class. They are generally not expected to respond to emails outside of normal working hours. In the case of emergency please contact the school office via email on olmcwenty@parra.catholic.edu.au or phone 8832 1100. Staff will return your call or respond to your email as soon as possible.

If your child's teacher has provided you with their email you can email them directly or send your emails to the school email account, which will then be directed to your child's teacher or another relevant staff member. This helps us to have confidence that we are aware of any matters needing our attention as a team, and that you are connected to the person who can best help.
