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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

Being the principal of a school community is a privilege. It is a privilege that parents and children invite me into their lives, to be a part of their journey as a family. On a daily basis I get to witness the happiness that this relationship provides, when I get to share conversations, greetings and all the stories of family events and personal achievements. Joyful events are easily shared. I am also privileged in my role when you invite me to share the challenges of your lives, your personal struggles and sadness. I am humbled when parents feel that they can share their burden with me. At times I am able to offer practical help and at other times the comfort of just listening and knowing that someone else understands the challenge you face is enough. It takes courage to let people see the light and dark of our lives.

The events of the past few days have highlighted for me the true meaning of community. Being a community means that we share in celebrating the joyful highs and offering consolation with the crushing lows. Over the weekend I received the news of the death of one of our father's Tom Pukerua. Tom is the father of Kiara (Year 6) and former OLMC students Leon, Marlon and Jayden. The children along with their mother, Laura have been comforted by the many messages of support from their friends within the OLMC community.

When great sadness and loss come into our lives it is difficult to understand why it happens. We naturally feel an array of emotions from great sorrow, anger and numbness. As a Catholic community, during these moments we turn to prayer and asking God to guide us through this sorrowful time. We pray for the person we have lost, their family and ourselves. Yesterday our Year 6 community and staff took time out to observe this Catholic ritual and prayed to God to embrace Tom into his loving arms. We asked God to bring comfort to Kiara, Leon,

Marlon, Jayden and Laura. We also asked God to help us find the way to support our friends in their time of grief. I am sure that all of our community will keep the Pukeru family in their prayer intentions.

Another privilege of my role as principal is to read the reports of our children and celebrate their successes as individuals. It is wonderful to see the effort that each child, supported by their teacher, puts into becoming the best possible learner they can be. Our teachers have worked hard to give you a clear and thorough report on what your child has achieved and what are some areas for them to continue to develop. As you read your child's report, discuss with them what they feel they have done well and what goals they are going to set for themselves during Semester 2. I hope that during your meetings with your child's teacher you bring the spirit of curiosity and respect to your discussions as we work in partnership to help your child be their best self academically, spiritually and socially.

OLMC COMMUNICATION & NOTES

Over the past few weeks we have received many phone calls from parents and students coming to the office to request copies of notes. We are asking for your support in minimising the numerous copies that the office prints. If you are missing a note, first check your child's school bag and their note folders and also ask your child to check their classroom tub. If the note has been misplaced you can go to the school website and download the note from the 'notes and forms' tab or use this link Notes and Forms. Our school website has a lot of information for families, including our weekly newsletter. Notes are not on Compass and reminders are not sent for excursions or class reward/mufti days.

COMPASS & MEDICAL CERTIFICATES

Did you know that you can add your child's medical certificates directly to COMPASS? When you add this directly into COMPASS. it automatically saves and the teacher can view it instantly. This also reduces the risk of it going missing in the thousands of emails teachers receive each day on lost in your child's bag. We encourage all parents to use this function. It can be found by opening the app, selecting 'MORE' 'OPEN IN BROWSER' and 'ADD ATTENDANCE NOTE' for your child. You enter the details and then click 'ADD ATTACHMENTS'. You can now browse your camera roll or take a photo of your child's medical note to upload.

YEAR 3 AND 4 POLICE VISIT

On Wednesday 14th of June Year 3 and 4 were visited by a representative from the New South Wales police force. The visit focused on Cyber Safety and how students can protect themselves online. Students learnt about many important topics including: cyber bullying, privacy, being respectful online, gaming and social media.

<u>Mansi 3B</u> - I learnt that there are different ways that you can be in danger online. When you feel that you are in danger online you should ignore the danger and tell a trusted adult
