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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families.

Easter is the most significant event of the Christian calendar. It is a period of intense sorrow brought about by the death of Christ on the cross (Good Friday) but also of great spiritual happiness through the miracle of the Resurrection (Easter Sunday).

As Lent ends this week, Holy Week begins with Palm (or Passion) Sunday this weekend. The scripture this week focuses on Christ's Passion, retelling the events of his last moments on Earth. Over the next two weeks I thought I would share The Stations of the Cross which have a profound message for each of us, every day.

Station 1: Jesus is Condemned to Death - "When I look at the unfair judgements endured by Jesus for our salvation, I think of the judgements I have made in my lifetime. I mistreat innocent people and sometimes, sadly, those closest to me. I rush to judgements when patience is needed. Even my own relationship with Jesus is sometimes marred by unjust thoughts... standing beside Jesus he bore my sinfulness in silence, I experience a mix of regrets and a power flowing from him into my soul."

Station 2: Jesus Takes His Cross - "I have lived long enough to know that everyone has known physical, emotional and spiritual pain. It is unavoidable....Facing my pain, disappointments, losses, betrayals, dreams unattained, I need to live my own version of Christ's passion. I do not suffer alone. Jesus is with me in those who stand by my side, my sickbed, my embarrassment, my office, my parish, my home."

Station 3: Jesus Falls the First Time - "My final goal in life is life and joy with God in heaven. From my life experience, I know that the journey is determined by the goal. ... Every journey has potholes, both physical and moral challenges. I won't forget that Jesus arose after each fall. He is my secret power to do so."

Station 4: Jesus Meets His Mother – "Mother Mary reminds me of my need for family support in times of suffering and loss. In such trying times I reach out to family and friends to help me get through the experience. I stop to think of all those whom I want to forgive, and ponder how much I want to be forgiven once more for wounds I have inflicted."

Station 5: Simon of Cyrene Helps Jesus - "I know times when I have been asked to give care to a loved one, a neighbour, a co-worker, a stranger. I find sometimes that I want to say 'no; when asked to give care, but son I say 'yes' and get on with doing what is needed. At these times, I try to see the image of Simon, who said, 'no' but then carried the cross of Jesus and was blessed by God's Son. Simon made it possible for Jesus to accomplish the final act of salvation at Calvary, and I want to have that same privilege."

Station 6: Veronica Wipes Jesus' Face - St John Paul II, frail in his later years, wore his cross publicly. When asked if he intended to resign the papacy, he replied. 'Did Jesus come down from the cross?' The wounds to my pride sometimes are worse than the ones to my body. Jesus looked awful on the way to Calvary, yet he paused and let a kindly woman clear his face. He rewarded her with an imprint, but more so with gratitude."

Station 7: Jesus Falls Again - "Jesus fell and got up for me. I know love made him do this. Infinite love will do the unthinkable. When I tired of being beaten into the ground, I know that Jesus wants to give me the strength to get up again. That's why he experienced falls – need to thrive spiritually and physically."

For those parents/carers who would like more information about the survey and would like to come and do it with other people we invite you to attend an 'Introduction and Survey' session in the school library on the following dates and times:



ATTENDANCE NOTICES

Regular school attendance is an important factor in a child's success at school. The average attendance rate for our school is currently 82%. Our school target is an attendance rate of over 90%. Ensuring that your child is at school on time each day is a key parental responsibility.

There will be times when your child is unwell that it is perfectly reasonable for them not to attend school. When planning family holidays we encourage parents to plan these during holiday periods.

When your child is absent from school you are to notify the school with a reason for your child's absence. The easiest way to do this is by responding to the text message that is sent via the Compass app. If you receive a letter from the school requesting an explanation, please complete it and return it to school the next day. These letters are sent home with children each Wednesday.

LAST CHANCE TO ORDER WINTER UNIFORMS

Have you organised winter uniforms for your child/ren? *Have you updated your child's 2023 class on the app?* This update makes it easier to get the uniform order to the right class. All orders for uniforms should be placed using the Qkr app by 4pm on Tuesdays so that delivery can be made each Thursday. **The last day for ordering this term will be Tuesday 4 April**. Students wear their full winter uniform from the beginning of Term 2. Please check and ensure that **all items are labelled** with your child's name and it is still visible. If you purchased second hand uniforms you will need to add your child's name.

GIRLS

Tunic - School tartan tunic

Blouse - Lemon long sleeved blouse with Peter Pan collar **Tights or socks** - Navy blue ankle or knee high socks or navy blue tights

Hair - Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back. No hair colouring is permitted. Cultural braids should be in a natural colour and tied back. Hair ties, ribbons and headbands must be yellow, navy blue or school uniform pattern.

BOYS

Trousers - Navy blue half elastic backed trousers **Shirt** - School blue long sleeve shirt with school crest **Tie** - striped school tie

Socks - Short grey school socks with blue/gold band **Hair** - Neat and simple haircuts that are graduated. **No** undercuts, number ones, rat tails, mullets, hair colouring, visible lines or patterns cut in. Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be tied back.

Jumper - Fleecy royal blue jumper or Wool/Nylon jumper - optional **Zip Jacket** - Royal blue with school crest (also part of the sports tracksuit)

During Term 1, we noticed that the hairstyles of some of our students do not match our school uniform policy. Girls are reminded that their hair should be tied back if it is longer than shoulder length. Our boys' haircuts should be blended and no shorter than a number 2, **without visible lines, mullets or any other fashion styles**. Discipline and personal presentation are often elements that parents name as part of their reason for enrolling at our school on. We appreciate parent support in ensuring haircuts are school appropriate as we move into Term 2.

ENHANCING CATHOLIC SCHOOL IDENTITY (ECSI)

WHAT is it?

ECSI is a project which aims to enhance the Catholic Identity of our school. It uses a variety of survey instruments to assess attitudes among students, teachers, staff and families towards how our community relates to, experiences and expresses our Catholic Identity.

WHO participates in it?

Over the next three years, all Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese learning communities will embark on the ECSI journey. Some schools have already pilotted the program.

WHERE was it developed?

The foundations of ECSI are rooted in the works of the Faculty of Theology and Religious Studies, at the Catholic University of Leuven in Belgium. It has been implemented in a number of dioceses within Australia, including Melbourne, Adelaide and Brisbane.

WHY are we doing it?

Catholic education in the Diocese of Parramatta is a ministry of the Catholic Church, walking humbly in the way of Jesus, serving all of God's people. We are called to respond to our 21st century context by developing a Catholic identity that is characterised by dialogue.

As Pope Francis reminds us,

"We cannot create a culture of dialogue if we do not have identity".
