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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

Today is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of the most important period of our church year, the Lent and the Easter Season. The events that we remember during this period are the foundation of our Catholic Religion. Each time we attend Mass as a community we recall these events when Jesus made his earthly body the sacrifice for all humankind.

Today I share with you an excerpt from an Ash Wednesday homily by Pope Francis' that I thought was thought provoking:

'People often remark on the way our churches are filled on Ash Wednesday. It's not a holy day of obligation. No one is required to attend Mass or receive blessed ashes. But there's something about the beginning of this season of Lent that draws us in, calls us to return to sanity, to a bit of austerity, to a change of heart and mind. It's a second chance at our new year's resolutions, long since broken and forgotten. It's a second chance at making changes in our lives. For some people, it's no less than a second chance at life. That something that draws us is God's grace. And it draws us back to God's merciful embrace.

There's something attractive about Lent beginning in the middle of an ordinary week, catching us in the midst of our daily occupations and asking us to take time out to find God there. Lent doesn't take us away from our ordinary lives, but rather it invites us to bring a new and holy attention to those activities. This should be the way with all of our spiritual practices. We take time apart in order to return to our daily activities with new inspiration. God will always surprise us with possibilities when we least expect them. Let this Lent be one of those surprises.

Each year when Lent comes along, I often think of a conversation I once had with an elderly friend. He told me that he thought giving things up was an easy thing to do during Lent. Something more challenging is to reach out to those we sometimes lose sight of and to be of service to others. It can mean a great deal when we stop for a few minutes to have a chat with someone, simply sharing your time is a great act of service. Lent is our opportunity to show the God in us, to be models of grace and allow others to feel God's embrace through our actions.

ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS

Please ensure that you access COMPASS to enter an absence notification for your child as soon as possible. When you enter an absence notification, you must provide a reason for why your child is away. Please be as specific as possible. If you forget to enter your child's attendance before the roll is marked you will receive a SMS to notify you of your child's absence from class. This SMS includes a link which you can use to easily add the reason for your child's absence. However, this link is only live for 24 hours, after which you will have to enter the app and provide a reason. Any unexplained absences will be followed by a letter asking for your explanation. Please complete and return to school as soon as possible as it is a legal requirement that we keep accurate records of student attendance data.

STUDENT ILLNESS

During the past week we have had a number of children who have come to school and been sent home as they are unwell, all before 11am. While restrictions regarding student illness are back to pre-covid protocols, we still ask parents to use common sense in regards to sending children to school if they are unwell. The rule of thumb is, if you are medicating your child to get them to school, apart from regular or seasonal medication, they are too sick and should be kept at home. If your child has a high fever, vomiting, is coughing up phlegmn or sneezing constantly and what is coming out is any other colour besides clear, then they are too sick. Students who are unwell need to stay home, rest and recover.

Parents are also asked to be respectful to school staff who call to ask for a child to be collected. Knowing that a call for child collection is inconvenient to families, our office staff monitor all children for a significant amount of time prior to calling you, this helps to rule out other factors and make sure a child pick up is warranted.




HIGH SCHOOL ENROLMENTS

Many of our families consider the following Catholic High Schools for their children:


