Dear Families.

We continue on our Lenten journey towards Easter. On the second Sunday of Lent each year the event of the Transfiguration is presented to us so that in pondering this mystery of Jesus' glorified humanity, we may be brought into a deeper awareness of his divinity. During the first two weeks of Lent we are presented with the two natures of Christ: humanity and divinity.

During my personal Lenten journey, I have been using a publication called Triumph, which is a Lenten program from the Wollongong Diocese. I thought I would share an interesting reflection with you from Mother Hilda Scott who is a Benedictine Sister.

I once heard someone say all truth is God's truth. Therefore, if something is true, it is God's. Vatican II confirmed this in the document, Nostra Aetate (Declaration on the Relation of the Church to Non-Christian Religions): "Likewise, other religions found everywhere try to counter the restlessness of the human heart. each in its own manner.... The Catholic Church rejects nothing that is true and holy in these religions." It is said that the Buddha was and everywhere he making his way to a distant land. looks, he sees you. There was a mountain to cross, and he simply took himself over the mountain. Needless to say, he was very exhausted when he had completed his feat. He was a portly sort of person, well-endowed you might say! He took some refreshing water from the cool clear stream and sat on a sturdy rock under a shady spreading tree. He closed his eyes and began to meditate. It happened that a trim, stately young soldier came by and seeing this overweight figure sitting on the rock, he scoffed, "You look like a pig!" The Buddha opened his eyes, looked kindly at the soldier and said quietly, "And you look like God!" Caught off guard, the soldier asked the Buddha: "Why do you say that I look like God?" "Well," the Buddha replied, "I have just walked over the mountain and I thought of God, I saw him in the majesty of the place. I came to the cool waters of the stream and I thought of God, I saw him in the comfort and refreshment the waters brought me. I sat on this comfortable rock and I thought of God. I saw him in his care and concern for my wellbeing. I closed my eyes in prayer and I thought of God. So, when I opened my eyes and saw you, then it seemed to me that I was seeing God. You saw a pig. I wonder, what have you been thinking about?"

Isn't it true? Let's ask ourselves, what have we been thinking about? Have you ever watched a truly frightening film before bed and had it replay itself in nightmares as you slept? Whatever fills your life comes out. I knew a little boy once, "Jacksin" [sic], whose home life was utterly awful. As a little lad of five, the other children in the class were wary of him. He treated them the way he was treated. He spoke to them as he was spoken to. What filled his little

> life was lived out in word and deed every day. As a result, the sight and experience of kindness had no effect, he could not see past his own life.

Peter, James and John went up a mountain with Jesus and saw a vision that they knew belonged to, and was of, God. They saw that vision because the greater things had now filled their consciousness. They saw what was already within them, and they did not know it was there. You and I

need no such mountain. We need only to fill our lives with what is good, be people who talk with God, and we will see God, without any mistake.

Here is a little-known fact as well: God has his own transfiguration every day because he thinks of you, and everywhere he looks, he sees you. He doesn't need to climb a mountain either—it's enough to think of you.

Perhaps this week you might just make an effort to think gracious thoughts, and you will be in line with God who only thinks gracious thoughts about you.

The teachers will also share with you the goals that your child will be working on during Semester One.






