

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families,

When someone we love dies we become acutely aware of a large absence in our life, an absence that seems to fill the world. The death of those we love brings a sharp focus on their unique quality, and we often regret that we didn't make enough room for them in our life. Any of us who has watched the last moments of life know that it can become a time of regret and reproach – when our sorrows can take the form of wishing: "If only I had..." Human nature brings this natural response to our mindset. Personally my experience when losing my father had been this response, not through guilt but just wishing for more time and as the years without him continue, the family joys that he does not get to experience or the pain of his absence.



In Sunday's gospel we hear how the death of Lazarus leaves a large absence in the lives of those who loved him. By the time Jesus arrives, Lazarus is already dead, and Martha voices her regret: "if Jesus had been with them earlier, things would surely have turned out differently. But Jesus' absence is essential to the story." Certainly, Martha felt that Jesus had let them down badly. But not so. Through Lazarus' death and return to life, Mary and Martha have their faith in Jesus strengthened and their friendship with him deepened.

Friendships with God or with another person is a precious gift. Like all precious things it must be protected and nurtured through trust given and received in times of apparent failure as well as in times of joy.

Is there a friend of ours in need of our trust or our forgiveness?

Is there something in our lives that needs to be "unbound or let loose" so that our friendship with Jesus and one another can be renewed?

Let us not be saying "If only I had..." without giving it our absolute best shot.

We pray for all those loved ones we have lost.

CELEBRATING BIRTHDAYS AT OLMC: REMINDER

Over the past few weeks we have had many parents wanting to provide their child's class with a range of birthday celebration treats. This is a reminder that as a school we WILL NOT accept or distribute any treats provided for birthday celebrations, this includes, but is not limited to lolly Bags/Birthday Cakes/Cupcakes, offers to buy the class or Grade ice blocks etc.

The first reason is based on our duty of care for our students. Many of our children have allergies to a range of food products, this risk increases when shared products are brought in. Some of our children are also on medication, shared treats can impact the effectiveness of this medication... and no we can't just leave those students out.

The second reason is one that you may not have not considered. Many of our families have different pressures which impact their ability to provide a mass amount of treats for birthday celebrations. Therefore the providing of treats inadvertently creates a divide between the 'can

do's' and 'can not's'. As a Catholic community it is our responsibility to ensure that the policies and procedures we put in place clearly reflect our call to support the 'common good'. This does not mean birthdays go without notice. Every child is made to feel special on their birthday. Our policy, which can be found in the Parent Handbook, states, 'each class teacher will celebrate children's birthdays in their own special way... the class might sing to the birthday child, the teacher may give a gift from the prize box, a card etc'.

In this day and age of excess, we firmly believe this is ample within a school setting. We would like to thank the parents who have recently made contact with the school to clarify this, before buying.

Mrs Anderiesz will be taking a period of well deserved long service leave between 28 March and 28 April.


During this period Mrs Diaz will take on the Acting Assistant Principal role. Mrs Thomas will take on the role of Acting Religious Education Coordinator.
