Dear Families,

You may have heard the word Synod mentioned at church or read about it online or in the Catholic media or you may be unaware of it. A Synod is both an event and a process where clergy, consecrated and the laity gather to discuss important matters relating to the life and mission of the Church. Synods are transformative events that lead to renewal in the Church's life.

The very first Diocesan Synod for the Diocese of Parramatta will take place in October this year. It will be an opportunity for clergy, consecrated people and the laity to listen, discern and respond to the Holy Spirit through the voices of the People of God in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains. These voices are your voices!

Each one of you is invited to be a part of this first synod of Parramatta. The hope is that the synod inspires us to listen to the Holy Spirit and to renew participation, communion and mission in the life of our local church. The success of the Synod relies on our participation. Our Bishop wants to hear from the entire community. He wants to hear about the needs and hopes you have for our local church.

Just like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we are called to recognise God who walks with us. There are many ways you can have your voice heard. Between now and July 31 families are encourage to get involved by making a submission to the Synod process through the *Diocesan Synod Website*.

The Diocesan Synod team has created a new resource for you and your family to share your stories and hopes for the futures of the Church in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains from the comfort of your own home. Download the family and child-friendly resource from the family and child resources section <u>with this link</u>. You can even make an individual submission <u>with this link</u>. All submissions will be reviewed and synthesised by a Synod working group and will inform the development of agenda for the Synod in October.



I encourage all of our families to make this your holiday task to come together and use the resources to discuss your needs and hopes for our church. Create your submission and have your say about the future of our local church.

I wish all in our community: students, staff, parents and friends a restful and safe Winter break. I thank you all for the daily contribution you make to our school community.

E-SAFETY FOR FAMILIES



It is no secret that many of our older students will remain at home, most likely with older siblings, while parents work over the holidays. While your older children may be responsible, this supervision is very different to that of a parent. So, now is the time for our families to evaluate the expectations, safety measures and restrictions in place to ensure your child remains safe online.

Access to the internet and digital technologies provide many benefits, however, we must also be aware that this comes with a unique set of challenges. Do not assume that your child 'knows' how to be safe online, or 'understands' the long-lasting impact of their digital footprint. While students learn about this at school, these are lessons they will continue to learn into adulthood. The eSafety Commissioner is an Australian Government body that provides support and information for parents about online safety. It covers topics such as online safety, social media, screen time and inappropriate content. The website also provides

tips on how to tackle difficult conversation about the inappropriate content with your children. As parents it is important to set expectations around device use and regularly check your child's activity.

PRESENTATION MATTERS

As adults we know that the way we present ourselves matters. Our parents and community value the self discipline our children learn by wearing their school uniform correctly. When we present ourselves well it projects to others that we respect ourselves, our school and those around us. Thank you to parents who supported their children in wearing their Winter uniform correctly this term and had appropriate hairstyles.

The holidays are often a time when haircuts happen in preparation for the new term. We ask parents to remember the school expectations regarding hairstyles. Girls are reminded that their hair should be tied back if it is longer than shoulder length. For girls with extremely long hair it is advised that it is worn braided, in a bun or a style that reduces the risk of getting caught. Cultural braids should be a natural colour that matches the child's natural hair. Our boys' haircuts should be blended and no shorter than a number 2, without visible lines, mullets or any other fashion styles.

Last Friday all student learning reports were uploaded to the COMPASS parent portal. This allows parents to have easy access to this Semester's Report. To access your child/ren's reports parents log into COMPASS, select your child, select 'Reports' on the top toolbar and choose the report you want to download. These can be downloaded on both mobile and desktop. Parents are reminded that only reports from 2021 or later will be available as this is when we began using the COMPASS system.



HAVE YOU THOUGHT ABOUT LETTING YOUR CHILD CATCH A BUS TO SCHOOL?

I know that many of our families feel frustrated at drop off and pick-up times. Parents waiting in queued traffic, losing patience with those who don't do the right thing. Did you know that a way to reduce this stress in your life is considering the use of school buses. We have a number of school buses that our families can access in the morning and afternoon. Primary school students are eligible to apply for a School Opal Card For children in K-2 there is no distance limit, for children in Yrs 3-6, the minimum distance is 1.6km straight line or 2.9KM walking. If you decide to give the bus a go, get in touch with the school and we will support your child and you through the process. Catching the bus is a great way for children to build their independence and resilience in a safe environment. The school buses listed below are not public bus routes, but school specific.
