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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families.

This coming Sunday we mark the feast of the Ascension. We are coming to the end of the Easter season and Chirst's presence on earth. Today I share a reflection by Diannne Bergant, a biblical theologian, for you to consider.

You and I..... We are Christ's new body on earth!

"The Feast of the Ascension is really a kind of transitional moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times; a moment when we have left one place in our journey, but have not yet arrived at a second. The Glory of the Risen Christ has already been revealed in us, but not yet totally. While the stories that describe the Ascension fit well into the unfolding story of redemption, the feast celebrates the exaltation of Jesus. The readings allow us to focus on this theological point while we commemorate a turning point in the life of the church. We do this by considering the enthronement of Christ in the heavens and the new body of Christ on Earth.

Many Easter accounts have directed our attention to the appearances of Jesus which were intended to strengthen the Christians' belief in his bodily resurrection.



This is a day we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at the right hand of God. This is a day to be overwhelmed by the reality of the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity.

Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the community of believers. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists. He ministers through its prophets and pastors. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have not been left alone; we have each other. Together we make up the new body of Christ."

NO COLLECTING STUDENTS DURING BREAKS

As all of our families know, we have a MASSIVE construction site at OLMC with our roof being changed. As parents can appreciate, this brings many different challenges, most of which we address and solve at a school level. One problem we can not solve is the early collection of children during breaks for appointments. When you collect your child during a break, we need to make an announcement over the PA for your child to know you have arrived at school. Your child then has to go and collect their bag from the classroom. This is usually a very easy task because we don't have tonnes of scaffolding impacting access in and around the school. As our roof repairs continue, how our students access the school



constantly changes. This is safe because they are always accompanied by a teacher, however during an early pick up this is not possible. Your child has to make their way into their classroom, using a path very unfamiliar to them which makes it unsafe!!!! If you are collecting your child early, please do so before or after break times, it will also reduce your wait time. **This** would mean collecting them before 11am or after 11:30am or before 1:30pm or after 2:10pm.

STAFFING UPDATE

Ms Vivian Mikhael has made the decision that it is time for her to retire from work. She will be taking a period of leave from the 23 May and will then resign her position. I know that I speak for everyone in expressing gratitude for the focused, caring and committed work with our children and staff since 2013 and we will be sorry to let her go. MEDICAL UPDATES

Please make sure your child's Asthma Plans, Anaphylaxis Plans and medication are all kept up to date. All plans must be current. All medication, including puffers, need to be within the use by date. If you receive an email or a note sent home with your child, please have your doctor fill in the forms and return them to school as soon as possible.

From Monday, 22 May to Friday, 9 June we will be inviting our students and parents to provide feedback on their experience of our school using an online survey. The 20 minute surveys are an important part of our whole school evaluation and planning process. Students will be given a random username and password to access and complete the survey online. Students' names cannot be linked to their responses which allows it to be completely anonymous. Results will show all student scores combined together – it is not possible to single out individual students in the results. The survey measures include wellbeing, physical health, and behaviours and attitudes linked to student success. ROAD SAFETY - U TURNS

Being responsible road users is the expectation of every driver. This means following all the road rules. School Zones are high traffic areas with hundreds of people driving in and out over two short periods of the day. This means that every driver must be alert, patient, respectful and above all safe. Unfortunately not all parents/family members doing the school drop-off or pickup are following the road rules. There have been a number of occasions where parents have been observed doing an illegal u-turn on Bennett Street. Any road which surrounds a school has double lines for the whole length, which means u-turns are not allowed. This includes Bennett, Garfield and Smith Streets.



We remind all parents to follow the road rules and in particular to do the following:

- Do not double park and have your child or other adults enter the car while it is illegally stopped
- Please park legally and obey the street signs
- If there is no available parking space, keep the traffic flow going and complete another lap of the block
- Do not park across our neighbour's and/ or up the Parish driveway.
- Leave enough time to account for the extra traffic and time it might take you to drop-off or pick up your child/ren

Date: Wednesday, 24 May 2023


Time: Drinks and canapes from 5.30pm. Panel Presentation and Q&A session from 6.30pm.
