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**PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE** 

#### Dear Families,

Last week many of our staff, including myself, had conversations with families centred around student social and emotional wellbeing. Some of these conversations were planned and regularly occur, however some were a result of the timing of the term. Week 6 and 7 of every term is challenging. Everyone starts to get tired and forget about what safe and respectful means in all contexts of the school day. However, any opportunity for staff and parents to work together needs to be viewed as a positive chance for partnership. This means, that in partnership, we are all striving to ensure that we provide our students with the opportunities needed to develop the emotional capabilities required to participate as active citizens. My own children have experienced not connecting with other students or not agreeing on the outcome of many many situations. However as a parent, I have always verbalised to my children, firm support for school decisions, even if I thought I may have done it a little different. This is because I understand that in the long run these experiences are building their resilience and ability to cope with the range of situations they will definitely face in their future.

Another way to build resilience in our children is to help them understand the differences between minor and major incidents. I have had many conversations about these differences and have really had to keep myself in check when asking my children about their days at school. Keeping it positive helps our children to move on. Questions such as, 'What did you learn today?' 'What was the best part of your day?' 'What is something new that you tried?' Keeps the tone of the conversation positive and focus on the most important aspects of them attending school.

An important aspect of working as a team is knowing the roles of each member and who to approach for help. Just like any organisation, we have systems in place to ensure parents receive the most accurate information and appropriate support. 1. Any issues regarding your child need to be directed to your child's classroom teacher FIRST, as they are best placed to discuss any concerns.

Each Stage of learning has a coordinator. Coordinators deal with ongoing or major issues. Parents might request a meeting with a Stage Coordinator AFTER they have spoken with the classroom teacher and still seek further support.
In serious cases, Stage Coordinators will direct issues to myself or Miss Pirovic. Parents can also request a meeting with us AFTER they have communicated with the classroom teacher and Stage Coordinator.

Please respect this process to ensure you promptly receive the most accurate information about any concerns you may have. Allowing the school to impartially deal with issues, demonstrates respect to the different parenting styles of all families within our community and ensures consistency of procedure.

No parent is to approach a child or another parent (whether in person or via online communication) when issues arise. Such contact only causes to heighten the situation and has lasting negative impact on all parties.

While we are accustomed to receiving lots of feedback, families have an opportunity to formalise their feedback and guide our actions towards school improvement. 

### SUBMITTING ATTENDANCE THROUGH COMPASS



Simply select 'Shortcuts' plus then choose 'Submit absence note' and then choose the child who will be absent. Absences can be entered the night before or the morning of absence.
