PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families

A few weeks ago you may have seen one of the greatest plays of all time doing the rounds on social media! It was during an annual Charity Match at London Stadium where one of the players, moments after being given a yellow card by the referee, hit back with a superbly-timed reverse Uno card. 'Uno reverse' is a phrase commonly used during the card game of Uno and is played to reverse the direction of play. For example, if the game is currently moving clockwise, playing a 'Uno Reverse' card will make it change to counterclockwise. As we move into Term 4 it is important to challenge our students to continue to strive and recognise when they need to use their own 'Uno Reverse' card, allowing them to turn setbacks and challenges into opportunities for growth to end the year on a positive note.



Adapting to Setbacks: Instead of dwelling on failures, students can use these experiences as opportunities to pivot, change their approach, and ultimately turn things around to finalise the year using a growth mindset.

Learning from Reversals: Just as in Uno, where the Reverse Card can change the direction of the game, students still have 10 weeks where they can reflect on the obstacles and setbacks they face, ultimately learning from these experiences.

Adjusting Year-End Goals: At the beginning and in the middle of the year, our students set academic and personal goals. As the year progressed, these goals were adjusted based on changing circumstances or new priorities. The "Uno reverse" concept encourages students to revisit their goals, reassess their direction, and make any necessary adjustments to ensure a positive finish to the year.

Resilience and Perseverance: Reflecting on the year with a "Uno reverse" mindset reinforces the importance of resilience and perseverance. It reminds students that even if they encountered difficulties along the way, they have the power to bounce back, keep moving forward, and finish the year on a high note.

Turning Challenges into Successes: A year of learning often involves various challenges, but these can be viewed as opportunities to showcase one's ability to adapt. Students thinking about challenges as learning opportunities promotes a positive approach to 2023, and sets our students up for success for 2024.

As we move towards the end of the 2023 school year, we encourage our students to recognise when they need to use their 'Uno Reverse' card to ensure they achieve their academic and personal goals.

STUDENT PRESENTATION

As Term 4 begins and our students transition into their summer uniform it is a good point in time for our families to reconsider how they want their child/ren to be viewed. During Term 3 there was a concerted effort by both teachers and parents to increase the expectations of our students' uniform presentation, and we saw a big improvement. However, what we haven't seen an improvement in is hairstyles. Our students' presentation is a package, it's not just about clothing, it's the whole message that we want to send to our community. While parents may consider certain hairstyles 'cute' on their child, they may not be appropriate for the learning zone, nor match the image we as a school community want to convey to the wider community.

Parents are also reminded of the uniform policy outlined in the Parent Handbook which clearly states "...children wear full school uniform at all times and we ask for parents' support in ensuring appropriate haircuts (no coloured hair, lines cut in or hair shorter than a No2)Suitable hairstyles mean... Shoulder-length or longer hair must be tied back. Long fringes must be tied or pinned back. Hair ties, ribbons and headbands must be white, blue or school check.

No undercuts, number ones, rat tails, mullets, patterns shaved in or hair colouring is permitted."

Please CLEARLY LABEL YOUR CHILD'S NAME ON ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING to ensure that lost items are returned.




YEAR 5 VISIT KU-RING-GAI NATIONAL PARK
